Town Ramps Up Enforcement Against Short Term Vacation Rentals

On October 20, 2015 the Town Council approved the issuance of legislative subpoenas for online booking sites such as VRBO, AirBnB, and HomeAway. The subpoenas will require the booking sites to produce records of all rentals within the Town limits. The Town's goal is to determine if any homeowners are renting their homes for stays of less than 30 days.

The short term rental of a residence – less than 30 days – is not permitted. Residential neighborhoods are intended for the use and enjoyment of long term residents. The Town's prohibition on short term rentals protects these neighborhoods from business activity that is better suited to registered hotels in the Town's commercial zoning districts. The Town Council has heard from residents who have voiced concerns with the noise, traffic, and loss of community that results from short term rentals. The subpoena process affirms the Town Council's commitment to protecting residents from these impacts.

Homeowners are reminded to refrain from renting their homes for stays of less than 30 days and to direct guests who wish to do so to the Town's registered hotels. With everyone's help we can retain the charm of Yountville and the clear distinction between its commercial zones and residential neighborhoods.

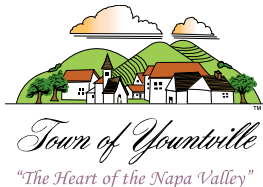
