Subject: Adopt Resolution Number 2530-06 Affirming that the County of Napa Department of Environmental Management is the Town of Yountville's Designated Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste

Background:

The County of Napa Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) is currently the permitting, enforcement and inspection agency for all solid waste facilities in the County of Napa including landfills, transfer stations and compost facilities and serves the town and cities within Napa County. The LEA is currently located in the County Executive Office.

Discussion/Analysis:

The Town of Yountville received a letter from the County of Napa dated November 9, 2006 notifying us that the County Executive Office is relocating the Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) to the County of Napa Department of Environmental Management located at 1195 Third Street, Suite 101, Napa.

Pursuant to Public Resources Code 43202, the State of California requires the County to provide a copy of a resolution from each town and city approving the relocation designation of the LEA.

Staff supports the request to relocate the LEA from the County Executive Office to the Department of Environmental Management.

Recommended Action:

1. Adopt Resolution Number 2530-06 Affirming that the County of Napa Department of Environmental Management is the Town of Yountville's Designated Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste and rescinding Resolution Number 1062-94.

Recitals

- A. Resolution Number 330, adopted June 14, 1977 designating Napa County Division of Environmental Health as the Town of Yountville's Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste.
- B. Resolution Number 908-92 affirmed Resolution Number 330 and designated Napa County Division of Environmental Health as the Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste.
- C. Resolution Number 1062-94 affirmed the request of Napa County and the Integrated Waste Management Board designating the Napa County Administrator's Office as the Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste.
- D. Government Code Section 43202 and 43203 of the Public Resources Code requires each jurisdiction to designate a Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste.

Now therefore, the Town Council of the Town of Yountville does resolve as follows:

- 1. Resolution Number 1062-94 adopted September 13, 1994 is hereby rescinded.
- 2. Affirm that the County of Napa Department of Environmental Management Office is the Town of Yountville's designated Local Enforcement Agency for Solid Waste.
- 3. Adopts Resolution Number 2530-06.

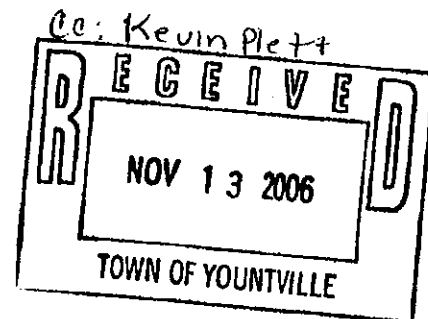

Dear Ms. Price:

The County of Napa will be relocating the Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) within the County Department of Environmental Management (1195 Third Street, Suite 101) from the County Executive Office (1195 Third Street, Suite 310). The relocation will enable similar environmental health programs, including the LEA to be located within the same department.

The Local Enforcement Agency is currently the permitting, enforcement, and inspection agency for all solid waste facilities in the County of Napa including landfills, transfer stations and compost facilities. LEA functions also serve all cities within Napa County.

The process of designating a Local Enforcement Agency and submitting the required information to the State of California Integrated Waste Management Board, pursuant to Public Resources Code 43202, the County must include resolutions from the cities within the County who also approve the re-designation prior to submittal to the State.

Enclosed is a copy of the Resolution from the previous change of departmental oversight for the Local Enforcement Agency to use as a template to present to your town council. Upon action by your town council, please forward a copy of your resolution. Upon receipt, the Napa County Board of Supervisors will approve the LEA relocation via Board Resolution prior to final approval by the State of California Integrated Waste Management Board.

Please schedule this action by your council at your earliest convenience.
