PEDESTRIAN SAFETY & ADA COMPLIANCE ARE IMPORTANT TO US IN YOUNTVILLE!



Yountville is recognized for being a walk-able and pedestrian friendly community. That reputation has developed over a number of years by the Town making it a priority to fund and complete annual improvements to our sidewalks, park paths, street curb cuts, and access to our Town facilities and programs.

In our community, over 50% of the residents are over the age of 60. The Town has worked hard to develop and improve the pedestrian accessibility in and around our community for our veterans residing at the Veterans Home, our two 55 and over manufactured housing communities, and a retirement community. More importantly, Yountville is a recognized Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) community and walking is an important part of a healthy lifestyle which we strongly support and encourage. This year's ADA and pedestrian accessibility improvements included widening the sidewalks on Washington Street in the center of town, new ADA curb cuts and bulb outs at the intersection of Humboldt and Yount Street which also serves to improve access to Yountville Elementary School, and a new ADA curb cut at the intersection of Finnell Road and Vista. We encourage you to get out and about and take stroll to see the completed work!

TOWN HALL STRUCTURAL STRENGTHENING PROJECT UNDERWAY



By now you have probably noticed the modular unit on the front lawn and all of the work going on at Town Hall. The Town Hall building, which was built in the 1930's and housed Yountville Elementary School, is a seismically unsafe building. The building is undergoing structural strengthening to help it survive an earthquake and make it safer for the public and employees using the facility. The \$3.2 million dollar project is on schedule for a completion by the end of the year. To date, the project has included removal of the clay tile roofing which has been stored on site for re-use, demolition of interior walls and excavation for a new foundation. The windows were removed and preserved and will be reinstalled and the new foundation is being poured as well as new walls going up. The project is progressing smoothly and we look forward to opening in the new year with a safe and beautiful building.
