HOPPER CREEK IMPROVEMENTS

In March 1998, voters approved the Measure A ballot initiative. Measure A funds are used to improve flood and drainage control. Beginning in late July and ending approximately in late December, the Town will be improving our flood protection. Construction will start at Hopper Creek by the French Laundry gardens, Finnell Street, Beard Ditch and Villagio Channel at the bike path. On Finnell, we will be adding new storm drains, sidewalks, curb gutters and lights as well. Additionally, the channel at Oak Circle will have significant path improvements.

The purpose of these projects is to ensure that the water will remain in the drainage area in the event of prolonged storm conditions. This project will also help make our annual sediment removal from Hopper Creek more efficient and effective. We are pleased to be working with Argonaut Constructors as the primary contractor, and we are confident in their ability to provide excellent work throughout this important and exciting project!
