- All wine tasting rooms within town limits.

Grand Tasting Pavilion (Wristbands required): Attendee must have a wristband to enter the tasting Pavilion

- Optional: All of the above mentioned restaurants, food and wine purveyors;
- Any and all non-Yountville based Chamber Members may participate in the pavilions.

Main Stage (Complimentary)

- In addition to the tasting pavilions, there will be a main stage in town where local artists will play from 12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. No ticket/ wristband necessary

How Do You Avoid a Parking Ticket?

A Friendly Reminder from Your Yountville Deputy Sheriff



The Town puts a great deal of effort into planning and trying to address problem areas with parking management efforts to keep our roadways as free flowing and safe as possible. As a tip, you do not have to be away from your vehicle to be in violation. Many of the regulations state, "no stopping, standing or parking". Just because you are still seated in your car or you, "just stopped for a minute" does not mean that you won't get a citation.

Here are some of our most common parking violations to help you avoid getting an unwanted note on your windshield:

- Parking Restricted – Look carefully for signs and curb markings before you park.
- Display of expired registration tabs- (not the same as expired vehicle registration) can be enforced on public land or in parking lots open to the public.
- Right wheel to right curb-- (enforceable if there is no curb) park in the same direction that traffic flows.
- Parking in the roadway – no part of your vehicle can block any portion of the traffic lane.
- Outside of designated stall – park between the marked lines if they are present (there is an exception for oversized vehicles, RVs, etc).
- Handicapped stalls and bus loading zones – Largest penalty fines of \$262.50.
