



Happy New Year!



Use the New NVTA Trolley App!

There is a new way to schedule a ride with the Yountville Trolley! The "Ride the Vine" app from the Napa Valley Transportation Authority (NVTA) puts shuttle rides at the fingertips of residents and visitors in several Napa Valley communities, including Yountville!



Residents can use this free app to request a ride and track the status of the shuttle. A "honk" push notification alerts riders when the shuttle arrives. NVTA says "It's like other ride sharing apps, only more affordable, with more leg room, and with a professional driver at the wheel."

The app is available in Apple and Google Play app stores by searching "Ride the Vine." Vine Transit operates shuttles in American Canyon, St. Helena and Calistoga. Fares range from 50 cents for youth, seniors and the disabled, to \$1 for adults. **The Yountville trolley is free thanks to the funding from the Town.** Riders can still order a ride on their computer or by calling (707) 312-1509. ADA Ramp and path at Oak Leaf Court

The asphalt walkway was replaced with an ADA compliant concrete pathway at Oak Leaf Court.



A replacement street light was installed adjacent to Hopper Creek Pocket Park. This replaces a Town owned and operated light on Washington Street with LED technology and town standard pole. The light also includes banner arms to display decorative banners.

New Art on the Yountville Art Walk



Cambré by artists Blaine Peters and Linda Johnson of Emmerieart Studio came to Yountville in late October. This piece came to Yountville from New Mexico and graces the corner of Oak Circle and Washington Streets in front of Wells Fargo Bank. The artists entirely unique process in translating the visual rhythm of a line drawing into a three-dimensional object has resulted in an enlightening exploration of how such rigid materials can emulate a trans-formative moment in time. Their work abstractly represents women in various poses, as if captured in a balletic moment, or in the midst of a complex emotion.
