



## Town Manager's Message On COVID-19

In these very uncertain times, on behalf of the Town of Yountville team, we thank you for your patience and understanding as the Town has had to drastically change the way we do business with you, our residents, and businesses. The protection and safety of our community is our first priority, especially given that we are a community with a significant senior population. The Napa County and later Governor's order to Shelter at Home has caused all of us to make drastic changes in our daily lives. For the Town it significantly altered the way we do business. We have had to cancel or postpone community events like Taste of Yountville, Yountville Live and Art, Sip and Stroll, not mention curtail our incredible parks and recreation programming at the Yountville Community Center and After School Program. We have had to cancel the Egg Hunt and related activities as well. These are not easy for us as we work very hard each and every day to create and build community by bringing you together. Our Parks and Recreation staff are working on resources for you while home including online ideas, outdoor ideas, phone and other ways to stay connected and engaged during our time at home. We are also finding ways to serve our residents and ensure we have ways to meet your needs, whatever those may be.

### Basketball Court Completed

The Town completed resurfacing of the basketball court recently. Residents will be able to enjoy pickup games without worrying that the surface is uneven or cracked.

### Hopper Creek Path Replacement

The project limits start at the intersection of the path with Yount St and extend to the next section of the path that has already been reconstructed. The contracts have been executed with Schaefer Engineering out of Santa Rosa for replacement of failing asphalt path with tan concrete. This work will complete the half of the path that was not replaced last year.

### Washington Park Water Line

The Washington Park neighborhood water infrastructure experienced failures. The first being a leak on the water main in Lande Way between Adams and Jasmine and the second (see photo below) being a rupture. The waterline in the neighborhood installed by the subdivision builder should last 50 years but are failing after 30 years. The Town contracted to assess the pipe condition in the entire neighborhood to make informed decisions as to which pipes need replacement. Deputy Public Works Director and Utility Operations Manager are finalizing priority sections of the water distribution mains to be replaced in a Base Bid and those that might be replaced in an Additive Alternate Bid, funding dependent. The present waterline project design is underway by a consultant.

### Oak Circle Street Rehabilitation Project


This is the Town's annual Measure T funded project that will resurface the street network within the Oak Circle neighborhood. Work consists of a 6-foot edge grind along the existing concrete gutters, then an overlay of hot mix asphalt, creating a new street surface. Work includes replacing the stamped crosswalk at the intersection of Washington St. and Oak Circle. Based on the scope of work and bid results, staff is exploring the opportunity to resurface Oak Leaf Ct. as a part of the project. Contracts have been awarded to the contractor Ghilotti Bros. Construction.

### Hopper Creek Path - Oak Circle to Mission

This project is to construct the continuation of the multi-use pedestrian path between Oak Circle and Mission Street along Hopper Creek. The total length of the proposed trail segment, including the bridge, would be approximately 450 linear feet. The pedestrian bridge would be approximately 80 feet long and would span the width of the creek from east to west. The pedestrian bridge would consist of a prefabricated, precast steel overcrossing that would be manufactured offsite.

### Joint Treatment Plant Office Project

Built in the mid-1970's, the Joint Wastewater Treatment Plant (JTP) is built to serve the Town and The Veterans Home. Since that original treatment plant construction, there have been no significant improvements to the treatment plant offices or staff support spaces. This office space modernization project for the wastewater building will include new ADA compliant spaces, restrooms, and locker rooms which are required under current law.
