



We Need Your Help with Water Conservation

According to the US Drought Monitor, Yountville and all other jurisdictions in Napa County are experiencing extreme drought. Precipitation across most of California has been much below normal. In response to the statewide drought emergency, the Veterans Home notified the Town that our Rector water supply needs to be reduced from 500 acre-feet down to a maximum of 400 acre-feet. To reach that goal, Town water customers needed to conserve a collective 20% of their water use to achieve this goal. To date, we are missing that mark.

For perspective, there are 325,928 gallons of water in one acre-foot. The amount Yountville needs to conserve is 100 acre-feet which is equal to 32,592,800 gallons (35.5 million gallons). For size and scale, a 20-ft long by 6 ft deep swimming pool holds +/- 32,500 gallons, so the town needs to conserve around 1,000 swimming pools worth of water in one year. This is a daunting task for sure, but one we have done before.

Help us save water! The Town wants to make sure we have water for next year, otherwise, we could face a dire situation and only you can help us avoid it. The following information and tips focus on areas where everyone can make a big difference.

- The biggest culprit of water waste is landscaping, using an average of 40% to 60% of a home's drinking water. To avoid overwatering, turn off your automatic irrigation system, only water your lawn for a total of 20 minutes on your designated day and time, and allow your grass to turn into its natural brown/orange-ish color.
- Replace your thirsty turfgrass with drip-irrigated low water-use plants. The Town offers a Cash for Grass Rebate to help you make the change.
- In California, an average home uses around 108 gallons of water a day without landscape irrigation. A water leak can add 10% of your water. Check your home for any leaks. It will help us save water and lower your water bill as well.
- Make sure to check your toilet for leaks. They can waste up to 200 gallons of water a day!
- Running your washing machine or dishwasher only when full. If washing dishes or clothes by hand, don't let the water run continuously for rinsing.
- Don't use your garbage disposal, instead compost all your waste.
- Use a timer to keep showers to a 5-minute limit. This can save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
- Avoid running water to thaw food. Place food in the refrigerator overnight or defrost in the microwave.
- Just remember, every drop counts and every person can make a difference!
