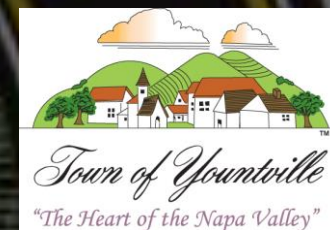

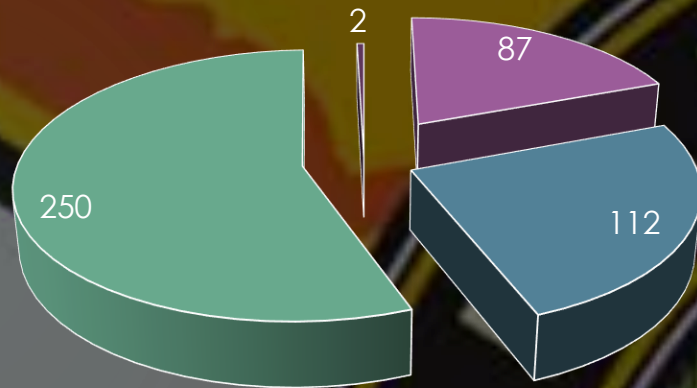

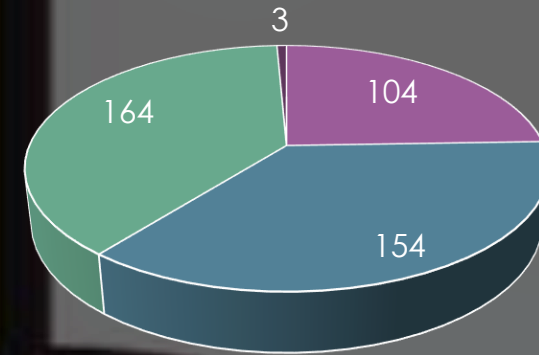

Requests For Service fourth Quarter 2018



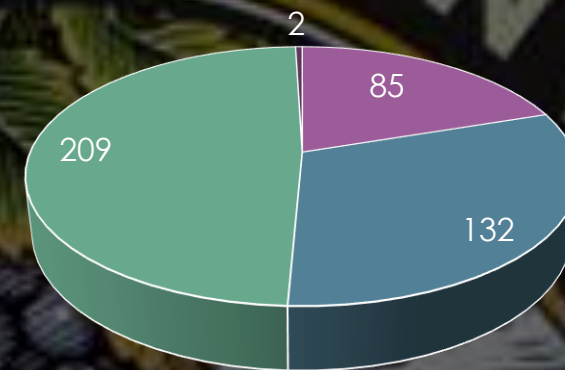

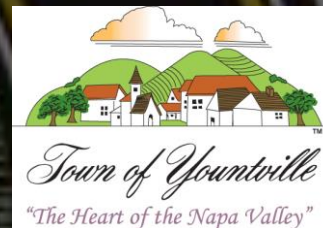

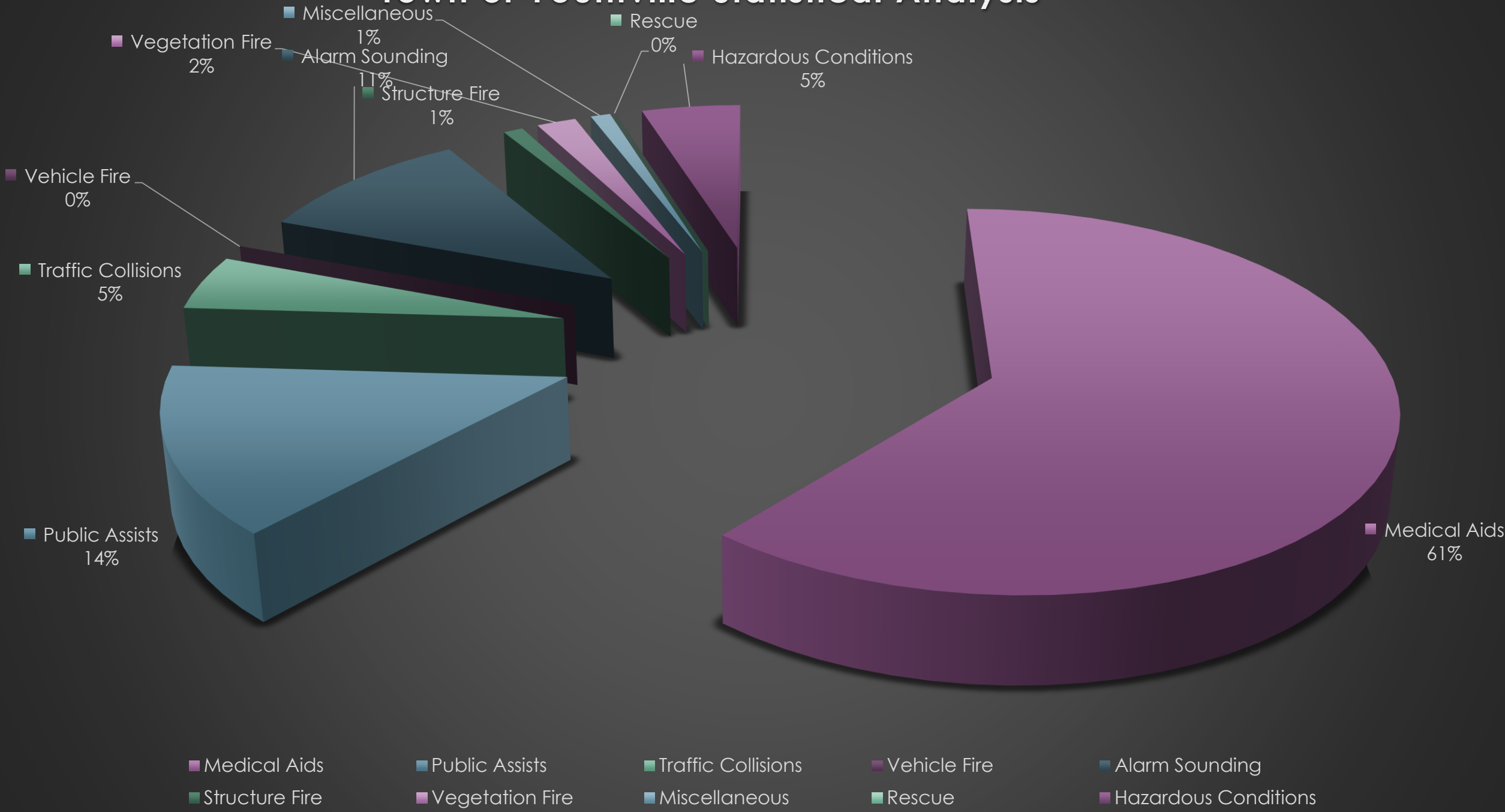
Requests For Service 5 Year Average

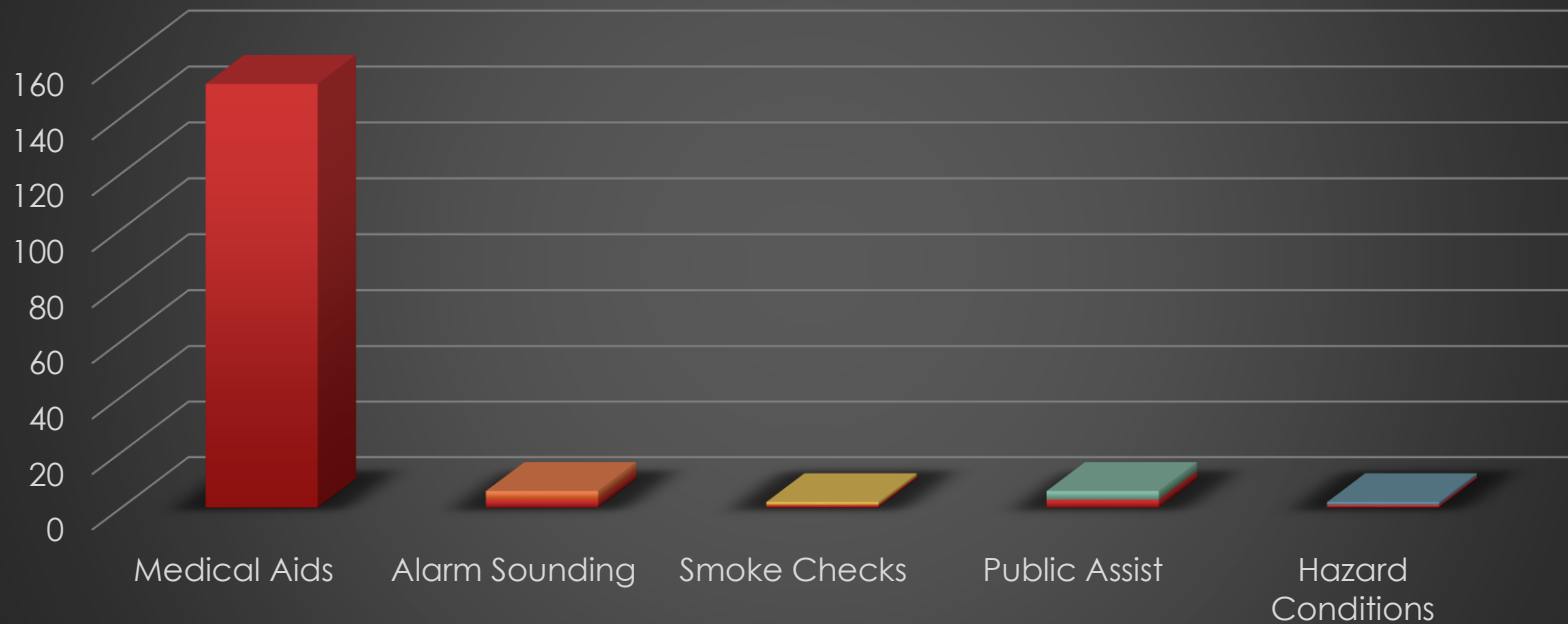

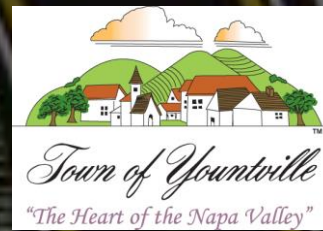

Statistical Analysis

There was a total of 425 calls for service during the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the Town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	64
Public Assists:	15
Traffic Collisions:	5
Vehicle Fires:	0
Alarm Soundings:	11
Structure Fires:	1
Vegetation Fires:	2
Miscellaneous:	1
Rescues:	0
Hazardous Condition:	5

Of the total 425 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	104 Calls
Veterans Home:	164 Calls
County Areas:	154 Calls
Napa City:	3 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past-history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies, however we have seen a rise in Tree and power lines down this quarter due to the fire activity.

Major Events

Hot Air Balloon Incident

On the morning of October 13th Engine 12 responded to a crash of one of the local hot air balloons on Mount Veeder. Engine 12 assisted in the rescue and medical assessment of the occupants and spent five hours at scene.

Hazmat Response to Sonoma

On November 16th, Engine 12 responded as part of a mutual aid request to Sonoma County for a fuel tanker rollover. Roughly 3500 gallons of diesel fuel was released, which could have potentially impacted the Sonoma Creek which flows into San Pablo Bay.

Rector Reservoir Mercury Spill

On December 16th a small mercury spill was contained with a response from Station 12 units along with the Napa County Hazmat Team. There was no environmental impact or negative effects to the water supply.

Traffic Collisions

Station 12 units regularly respond to a large amount of traffic accidents, most of with minor damage and limited injuries. This past quarter was an exception. It seemed as though most of the vehicle accidents responded to be Station required that we use our extrication equipment to remove patients from vehicles. The wet weather certainly played a factor in some of the collisions. We would like to remind everyone to pay attention to the road and weather conditions, as well as reduce distractions while driving.

Special Events

Community Tree Lighting

Firefighters were again lucky enough to participate in the annual Tree Lighting. Station 12 personnel were happy to mingle and serve hot chocolate and provided fire prevention material to community members and kids.

Halloween Carnival

Station 12 personnel helped set up and staff some of the activities at the annual Halloween Carnival.

Fun Run

The firefighters at the station participated with the Elementary class for fun run. They gave them tips on exercising, running, and staying active. It always a great time and the firefighters always enjoy participating and spending time with the kids.

Volunteer Academy

In January, the county will kick off another Napa County Volunteer Fire Academy. The program takes candidates selected to be volunteers in the county and trains them on the fundamentals of fire, rescue and EMS operations. The pool of students comprises recruits from the nine volunteer stations located throughout the county of Napa. Once completed with the training program the recruits will be assigned to their respective stations where they will respond to emergency incidents.

Special Message

After the recent power outages, many residents came to us asking why their smoke or carbon monoxide alarms were making noise. What we found was that many had passed their shelf life and were letting people know that it is time to replace them. Most CO and smoke alarms now have a ten-year shelf life, however that does not always mean they last ten years. We at Station 12 encourage residents to periodically check their smoke and CO alarms, especially because those that are “hard wired” in may not have a functioning battery back up for when the power goes out.
