





Quarter 2018








Requests For Service 5 Year



Statistical Analysis

For the first quarter, there were a total of 504 calls for service. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	344
Public Assists:	17
Traffic Collisions:	26
Vehicle Fires:	1
Alarm Soundings:	64
Structure Fires:	17
Vegetation Fires:	0
Miscellaneous Fires:	1
Rescues:	6
Hazardous Condition:	28

Of the total 504 calls, the breakdown per response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	99 Calls
Veterans Home:	251 Calls
County Areas:	154 Calls
Napa City:	5 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past-history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies, however we have seen a rise in tree and power lines down this quarter due to inclement weather.

Major Events

This Winter has proven to be a busy one. Station 12 Personnel responded to multiple structure fires in the County and City of Napa areas.

Because of the large amount of rainfall this year, there were multiple calls involving flooding and traffic accidents caused by the rains. During the heavy rains Station 12 personnel staffed Utility 12 with two additional members beyond the four normally on duty. With the extra staffing the Station 12 could ensure that the fire apparatus would be free to respond to fire and emergencies.

There was an unfortunate amount of vehicle accidents this past quarter, some resulting in significant injuries and fatalities of residents and people visiting this beautiful valley. Station 12 personnel would like to remind everyone to only drive as fast as the conditions allows.

Special Events and Training

Volunteer Academy

In January, the County will kick off another Napa County Volunteer Fire Academy. The program takes candidates selected to be volunteers in the County and trains them on the fundamentals of fire, rescue and EMS operations.

The pool of students comprises recruits from the nine volunteer stations located throughout the County of Napa and a handful are from South Lake Fire. Once completed with the training program the recruits will be assigned to their respective stations where they will respond to emergency incidents.

Training

Station 12 personnel remain dedicated to honing and improving their skills in all areas from basic medical care to technical rescue. Most days Engine, Truck and Rescue 12 can be found at the Napa County Fire Department Training Grounds on Silverado Trail.

Outside of the regular training, Station 12 firefighters, as members, attend the Napa Interagency Rescue team drills, and the Interagency Hazardous Materials Response Team trainings, both held twice monthly.
