





Quarter 2020






Requests For Service 5 Year







## **Fire Department Summary**

#### **Statistical Analysis**

The attached spreadsheet shows a total of 357 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls for Station 12:

Medical Aids:	226
Public Assists:	32
Traffic Collisions:	29
Vehicle Fires:	0
Alarm Soundings:	35
Structure Fires:	10
Vegetation Fires:	5
Smoke Checks:	5
Rescues:	4
Hazardous Conditions:	9

Of the total 357 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	75 Calls
Veterans Home:	146 Calls
County Areas:	135 Calls
Napa City:	1 Call

Calls for the Veterans Home This Quarter:

Medical Aids:	138 Calls
Alarm Soundings:	3 Calls
Public Assists:	5 Calls

This data represents a lower call volume compared with history and call analysis. The COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent Government shut down has reduced the number of calls department personnel have responded to this quarter. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies.

## **Major Events**

### **Structure Fires**

The firefighters from Yountville Station assisted other County units in responding to a structure fire at the Bank of America building in Saint Helena. The fire started in the HVAC system and crews were able to keep the fire contained to the exterior of the building.

### **Vegetation Fires**

Fire activity has started to increase here in the County as of late. Recently Yountville personnel were dispatched to a vegetation fire along the newly constructed portion of Devlin Rd. Crews were able to contain the fire to under 2 acres and remained at scene for a few hours constructing handline and mopping up hot spots.

## **Special Events**

### **Drive Through Graduation**

In early June station personnel participated in a drive through graduation ceremony, celebrating the last graduating class of Yountville Elementary School. The Fire Engine led the procession of students and their families south down Yount St, turning and continuing south on Washington St to California Dr.

### **Fire Drills at the Vets Home**

Monthly fire drills at the Veteran's Home continue to be conducted. Fire crews from Yountville Station have been happy to participate and assist whenever needed by Veteran's Home staff.

## **Training**

### **Technical Rescue Team**

Monthly drill for TRT began again this June, training had been suspended due to COVID -19. This month the team practiced the lifting and moving of heavy objects. The training scenario consisted of stabilizing and lifting a large tanker trailer off of a 4-door sedan and then moving the vehicle out from under the tanker.

### **Volunteer Training**

In the month of June, Multi Company Volunteer drills were able to begin again. Yountville fire personnel were happy to be able to train with our local volunteer companies from Rutherford and Dry Creek.

### **Station Training**

Although we were unable to train for most of this quarter with our other county fire stations and volunteer companies, Yountville personnel take pride in training every day at the station level.

Now that we are in the heart of another dry summer, CAL FIRE would like to remind homeowners of defensible space. We encourage removing dead and dry vegetation within 100 feet of your home.
