





Quarter 2020





Average









Statistical Analysis

There was a total of 382 calls for service during the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	210
Public Assists:	18
Traffic Collisions:	30
Vehicle Fires:	2
Alarm Soundings:	51
Structure Fires:	15
Vegetation Fires:	14
Miscellaneous Fires:	0
Rescues:	6
Hazardous Conditions:	24
Smoke checks:	11
Cover Napa City:	1

Of the total 382 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	88 Calls
Veterans Home:	114 Calls
County Areas:	177 Calls
Napa City:	3 Calls

Calls for the Veterans Home this Quarter

Medical Aids: 108
Structure Fire: 1
Alarm Sounding: 4
Traffic Collision: 1

These averages are mostly consistent with past history and call analysis. There is a slight decline in overall call volume due in large part to the decrease in tourism from COVID-19 and the LNU Lightning Complex. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies.

Major Events

LNU Lightning Complex & Glass Fire

This past quarter has brought an incredible amount of fire activity, beginning with the LNU Lightning Complex in August and ending with the Glass Fire at the end of September. The winds along with the dry conditions created a true fire storm and devastation to our community and throughout the state. Our crews at Station 12 along with the Napa County Volunteers and many other of our cooperators including Law Enforcement were pushed to the limit. We're proud to say that Station 12 remained fully staffed with paid personnel throughout the entire fire siege. Our community has shown great determination and pride and have shown great support for one another as we move forward from this event.

Special Events

Berryessa Highlands

In the later stages of the LNU Lightning Complex engines from Station 12 took turns patrolling the community of Berryessa Highlands. We were there to support the community with anything they may have needed. Anything from providing them with needed information, to helping sift through ashes looking for valuables, to just being there as someone to talk to. It's a part of our job that we hope to never have to do but we proudly support our surrounding communities in any way we can in times of need.

Training

New Firefighter Academy

Station 12 personnel assisted with two CAL Fire new hire academies this quarter. The training consists of wildland and structure fire evolutions, modern fire behavior, and EMS skills. Assisting with these academies are a

great way for us to stay sharp by teaching basic skills to the seasonal firefighters and they provide us an opportunity to better our own fundamentals.

Trainings

During the last quarter the crews have been busy with multiple trainings. As always Station 12 personnel play a large role in keeping the Napa County Volunteer companies trained and ready to respond. We also take great pride in training on a daily basis in all aspects of our field to provide the highest quality of service possible.
