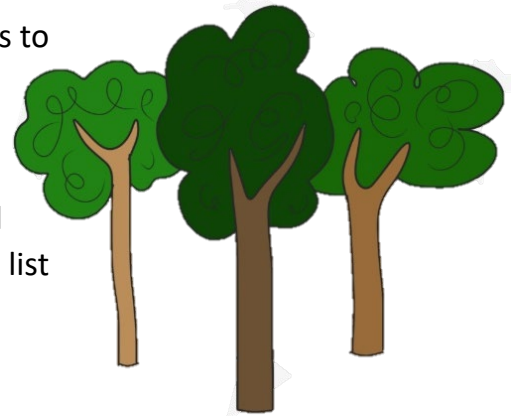


## Trees in Yountville: Recommended Species

Yountville’s urban forest is part of the town’s charm. The Town strives to maintain and increase the overall canopy coverage in Town – both for the comfort of residents and visitors, and for the health of the environment. Below are lists of trees that are approved to plant within Yountville. If you will be planting in an area where the tree will overhang the public right-of-way, please choose a tree from the third list – the “Master Tree List” (p. 4).



### 17.98.130 Recommended California Native tree list

The list of recommended California native trees is useful for those who are required to plant a native California tree due to a previous tree removal or as a condition of a design review, or for those who are looking to have local, drought-tolerant landscaping.

### 12.16.110 Master tree list

The following list is the approved master tree list of the types and species of trees suitable and desirable for planting within or adjacent to public rights-of-way. Trees 1 through 10 are recommended for narrow spaces (less than seven feet), and trees 11 through 30 are recommended for wider spaces (greater than seven feet).
